



- > 5-year term (Treaty of Lisbon)

# European Integration Forum how was it created?

Decided in the 2005 JHA Council conclusions, on the basis of a Commission proposal, but still not entered into force in 2007 when...

the Commission, in charge of its settlement, asked the EESC to reflect on the *elements for the structure, organisation and functioning* and then to co-organise the Forum

First meeting of the Forum was held in April 2009

(+ the launch of the integration website)

# European Integration Forum - how does it work?

100 participants from European and national level (representatives of the EU network organisations (1/3) and national organisations (2/3))

- 2 annual meetings
- Agenda based on the Common Basic Principles on Integration and the EC's work plan







- Involvement in the elaboration of integration policies; raising ideas & suggestions in the policy arena
- Assistance in the creation of European level organisations

- Image of migrants
