




Self-employment stable overall, but more without employees




Clustering the self-employed

















Stable own-account workers (26%)





Implications

- Majority of self-employed generally have good working conditions
- Self-employed are not always independent and autonomous
- Between the legal cracks
 - Dependence and subordination, but...
 - Social protection and representation may be lacking
 - Employee legislation does not apply

Improving criteria	
Using criteria of economic dependence to combat and identify bogus self-employment	Establishing criteria to clearly distinguish employment from self-employment
Germany, Latvia, Malta	Belgium, Ireland, Norway, Poland
