Convergence, an economic matter

- Economic convergence at core of European policy discourse
- 'Convergence' in the Treaty on European Union in 1992 relates to monetary and fiscal convergence
- Reflected climate of the European founders: Economic integration was organised at EU level and domestic social policies redistributed fruits of economic progress



United in Diversity?

- And it worked! The European convergence Machine
- ... until the economic crisis of 2008 caused Member States to diverge in their performance in the social dimension
 - Unemployment in Greece was more than seven times higher than in the Czech Republic
 - Italy's long-term youth unemployment rate was more than 20 times higher than the figure for Denmark

• United in diversity, but these are not the differences we are proud of



- Diverging economic and social performance among Member States warrant common concerns and threaten the stability of the Union
- They contradict the promise of shared prosperity and may signal a general lowering of living and working conditions
- In recent years, the term 'convergence' went beyond the economic dimension and increasingly greater emphasis was given to the need to promote also social convergence







The European Pillar of Social Rights


European Pillar of Social Rights serves as a compass for the renewed process of upward convergence among Member States performances in the economic and social dimension of the EU

European Pillar of Social Rights






Is Europe converging upward in the social dimension?





 The effect of the crisis was very limited with only limited fluctuations of the average and of the variability around the business cycle was recorded




 For these indicators, Euro Area converge more than non-Euro Area



- For other indicators the upward convergence trends are greatly affected by the economic crisis showing a strong cyclical evolution in both averages and variability
- In good times there is upward convergence (with improvements and lower dispersion) while in bad times there is downward divergence (with deterioration in levels and higher dispersion).




Employment rate

- For these indicators non-Euro Area Member States perform better than Eurozone
- These are the indicators for which Member States resilience should be strengthen in order to prevent future asymmetric shocks and build sustainable convergence




• Major fluctuation around the business cycle

Income Inequality


Precarious attachment to labour market

• For these indicators there is not a clear better performance of Euro Area against non-Euro Area and vice-versa






More work to do: Share of Involuntary part time

The importance of upward social convergence

- Upward convergence is happening
- However, in employment and poverty the fluctuations around the business cycle are ringing alarm bells
- It is important for Member States to strengthen economic and social resilience against future shocks and to build sustainable convergence
- Social convergence is important for the legitimacy of the European Union but has also cross-nationals implications
- Keeping monitoring convergence trends and implementing policies to avoid future divergence is essential



Implementation of the Pillar and promoting social convergence

- The political guidelines of the President-elect Ursula von der Leyen advocate for the full implementation of the European Pillar of Social Rights
- Implementation of Pillar is the responsibility mainly of Member States with the EU, who can support through the use of legislation, budgetary instruments and policy coordination







Options for action

- The European Unemployment Reinsurance scheme is one of the different options to promote macroeconomic risk reduction and, at the same time, convergence in socioeconomic conditions for the unemployed
- A fair minimum wage could increase lower wages and would reduce in work poverty and poverty risks improving the quality of life and also reinforcing domestic economy
- Quality of institutions. Social dimension is national responsibility but raises expectations about European Union. EU should not be seen as a threat against welfare systems but as a helpful body. Ensuring that funds are efficiently invested is important.



Conclusions

- The great recession revealed the **importance of social convergence**
- There is now a general consensus that economic and social convergence are mutually reinforcing and should go hand-inhand
- Patterns of upward convergence are recorded in several employment and socio-economic indicators. However, fluctuations around business cycle are ringing alarm bells for the sustainability of these trends
- Implementing policies to strengthen Member States' economic and social resilience is essential to avoid future divergence and to build sustainable convergence.
